Administrative History:** Paul Axelrod, professor, was born in 1949 and educated at York University and the University of Toronto where he received his BA and MA in 1972 and 1973, respectively. He received a PhD in History from York University in 1980. He has been a professor at York since 1982 and has been the Dean of the Faculty of Education since 2001. He is the author of numerous books dealing with his primary research interests of the history of schooling and higher education, the political economy of education, educational policy, adolescence, youth, and student life.
