|                                    | Daniel Cappon (1921-2002), psychiatrist and educator, was born in England on 6<br>June 1921, graduated from the University of London in 1944, and was trained in<br>medicine at St. Mary's Hospital in London. He commanded a psychiatric hospital<br>and medical division in the Far East from 1945 ti 1948, treating repatriated<br>prisoners of war in Burma and India. Cappon emigrated to Canada in 1950<br>following postgraduate work in psychiatry in the United Kingdom. He was first<br>associate, later professor of psychiatry at the University of Toronto (1950-1969),<br>and joined York University as a professor in the Faculty of Environmental Studies<br>in 1970. He wrote several studies including "Toward understanding<br>homosexuality" (1964), "Eating, loving and dying" (1975), and "Coupling" (1983).<br>Cappon served as an analytical therapist in Toronto since 1950, was a founding<br>member of the McLuhan Institute at the University of Toronto, and served as an<br>architectural consultant on several projects including Expo 67 and the CN Tower.<br>He died in 2002. |
