Biographical Sketch/ The "Onion", the Toronto paper on the arts, was a twice-monthly tabloid newsprint Administrative History: publication. It published fiction, reviews, essays, and artwork. The paper was edited by Stephen Mezei, an author, scriptwriter and instructor in the arts at several institutions, including York University (1974-1975). The Onion's editorial board included Pauline Carey, John Hebert, and other Canadian and foreign

writers.

Scope and Content: The fonds consists of typescript, corrected drafts of articles, subscriber

correspondence, and correspondence with the Ontario Arts Council and the Ontario Ombudsman's Office concerning a dispute that the editor of Onion,

Stephen Mezei, had with the Arts Council (1977-1979).
