**Biographical Sketch/
Administrative History:** John Montgomery Barber (1938-1974), educator, social and political activist and lawyer, was a co-founder of the Don Vale Community Centre and of the Point Blank School, a #free# school. Both were located in Toronto. He was also a member of the National Council of Welfare. Barber was a professor at Osgoode Hall Law School, 1967-1974.

Scope and Content: The fonds mainly documents John Montgomery Barber's activities as member of the National Council of Welfare.
